National Conference Notes

Military-Style Self Defense for Professional Women, Submitted by Buenita Lee

It was an opportunity to engage on hands-on methods of dealing with personal attacks from strangers. The basic is usually the knee in the groin, but Mr. Kyle Eastham provided new and innovative ways to deal with attackers, to provide brief opportunities to cripple attacker to allow you to run away. He does not suggest you confront your attacker, but to become interested in simply distracting for a brief period.

The presenter provided not only hands-on suggested moves, but provided insight of studies regarding how women are selected by their attackers. He suggests that we become very aware of our surroundings when leaving our car and upon approaching our cars. He suggests women remember not to park in dark or secluded areas, and to ask for an escort to dark areas of parking lots, be aware of strangers who bump into you. Do walk and text, have your keys ready for entry to your car.

Weapons are something that we can create out of most things in our purses and we should be aware if we find ourselves in fear of our lives. Suggested items are pointed combs, hairspray, keys between fingers, any blunt instrument and cell phone camera mode.

I was also pleased to know that a small female can provide protection for herself against a larger man given the correct movements and confidence to perform those movements. I really enjoyed the overall presenter's information and highly recommend him for others if he is there next.
